
#### Pressure to act in a professionally unethical way






of respondents who were put under pressure: Incentives were offered such as bonuses, promotion, favourable treatment and even holidays and cash


### **Consequences of pressure**

- future prospects threatened







### Resisting the pressure to act in an unethical way












